



Mount Auburn Preparatory Academy (MAPA) serves EK-12 students in Cincinnati with a well-rounded education that equips them with the 21st century knowledge and skills they need to prepare for a lifetime of learning. The newly updated campus features two playgrounds, a gymnasium, and a media room. Separate floors are

dedicated to upper and lower grade levels. Small class sizes, expansive student and family support services, and a wide range of extracurricular and sports opportunities provide the basis for student success beginning in Kindergarten all the way through high school graduation.

MAPA supports the educational and career aspirations of students as they progress through school. Students can participate in College Credit Plus beginning in Grade 7—a dual enrollment program where students earn college credit as they work toward high school graduation. MAPA recently approved a new, Career Technical Education (CTE) program to begin in the 2022-23 school year which will additionally help students identify potential career paths and begin building career-specific skills and knowledge.


STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

ACADEMIC PROGRESS


The academic goals of Mount Auburn Preparatory Academy during the 2021-2022 school year were to:

- Increase student achievement in English Language Arts by raising the raw performance index of 47.31/120 by 31 points according to the Ohio State Tests for grades 3-8 along with the English I and English II End of Course exams by June 30, 2022
- Increase student achievement in math by raising the raw performance index of 43.84/120 by 34.47 points according to the Ohio State Tests for grades 3-8 along with the Algebra I, Geometry and Integrated Math I End of Course exams by June 30, 2022
- Decrease the last chronic absenteeism reported on the state report card by 22.8% (from 62.8% to less than 40%) by June 30, 2022

Emerging from the pandemic, Mount Auburn Preparatory Academy did not achieve all goals but proudly reports a 100% graduation rate for high school seniors and a near 100% completion rate by K-8 students of the i-Ready Diagnostic (87% Reading and 86% Math). Additionally, the school increased its Performance Index (PI) score by 13%, bringing PI back to its pre-pandemic level.


Mount Auburn Preparatory Academy uses the i-Ready Diagnostic for Reading and Math as a nationally normed data tool. In grades K-8, 12% of students moved into Tier 1, 2% of students moved into Tier 2, and 14% moved out of Tier 3 in Reading. In K-8 Math, 13% moved into Tier 1, 7% moved into Tier 2, and 20% moved out of Tier 3. In grades 9-12, there was no difference in the Math tiers but in reading 4% moved out of Tier 3 into Tier 2.


CLASS OF 2022





POST GRADUATION PLANS

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance.
